4. First-aid measures

Description of necessary first aid measures

Inhalation	Under normal conditions of intended use, this material is not expected to be an inhalation hazard. If inhaled, remove to fresh air. Get medical attention immediately.

6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

- For non-emergency personnel** Keep unnecessary personnel away. Ensure adequate ventilation. Local authorities should be advised if significant spillages cannot be contained. For personal protection, see section 8.
- For emergency responders** Wear appropriate protective equipment and clothing during clean-up. Use personal protection recommended in Section 8 of the SDS. Keep unnecessary personnel away. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Ensure adequate ventilation. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, and clothing. 7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling

Obtain special instructions before use. Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood. Pregnant women should not administer this product. Women and men of childbearing age should exercise extreme caution when handling this product. Special care should be taken to avoid accidental self injection and needle stick injury when administering the product. Use a safety injector, preferably one which has a dual safety system providing both a needle guard and a mechanism to prevent accidental operation of the trigger. Handle and open container with care. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment. Provide adequate ventilation. Avoid breathing mist or vapour. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, and clothing. Avoid prolonged exposure. Wash thoroughly after handling. Observe good industrial hygiene practices. Avoid release to the environment.

Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Store locked up. Store in original tightly closed container. Protect from light. Refrigeration recommended. 2 - 8°C (36 - 46°F). Do not freeze. Store away from incompatible materials (see Section 10 of the SDS). Use care in handling/storage.
